



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

Thank you again for your generosity and your commitment to our mission. You are making a difference in the lives of our students and families, and in the future of our society.







CIS of Atlanta will serve more than 49.000 K-12 students. at 64 Metro Atlanta schools.

With the achievement of Vision 2021's primary target - 95% promotion/graduation -CIS of Atlanta moves onto our newest 5 year strategic plan. Vision 2026, CIS of Atlanta's comprehensive strategic plan, focuses on growing our programmatic footprint by continuing to provide critical dropout prevention services to more K-12 students and families, as well as expanding into post-secondary/alumni services.

The primary goal is that by 2026

95% of case-managed students will be promoted or will graduate, and at least 85% of alumni persist through college.

Five Priority Outcomes Include:

Secure Basic Needs: 90% of case-managed students receiving emergency assistance remain in school.



Social Emotional Wellness & Positive School Engagement: 75% of case-managed students with moderate re-engagement level.



School Attendance: 90% overall average attendance rate of case-managed students.
